

The Family Resource and Youth Services Coalition of Kentucky (FRYSC) distributed applications to students in grades seven through 12 wishing to participate as a Legislative page for their state senator or representative from their community. The fundamental goal of sponsoring the Legislative page program is to provide middle school and high school students with real life situations relating to social studies core content 2.4 and 2.15. This provides students who may not otherwise have the opportunity to participate as a Page and spotlight the role of the FRYSC in the educational process.

Students must complete an application, submit a statement in their own handwriting of 100 words or less telling "Why I want to be a Page in the Kentucky Legislature." They also submit an original poster or picture which depicts at least one way the Family Resource/Youth Services Center at the applicant's school has helped students and/or their families. Harlan County High School junior Autumn Dunaway was selected for this honor and served as the legislative page for Senator Johnny Ray Turner. She participated in the application process through the Harlan County High School Youth Service Center and Janet White, director.
