- UofL will continue to accept fall 2019 applications and award admission-based scholarships until May 1. Please encourage your students to submit their applications and updated test scores.
Orientation registration is now available. Please note: while the enrollment deposit deadline is May 1, students will need to accept their offer of admission and pay their deposit prior to registering for orientation.

There are several visit opportunities available for students this spring:
