- 1. Restraint & Seclusion. Compliance with 704 KAR 7.160. All school personnel shall be trained in state administrative regulations and school district policies & procedures regarding physical restraint and seclusion which includes positive behavioral supports. KET modules are the suggested format for delivery of the training (Found at PBS teacherline Course LEAD1103.4 Positive Behavior in Schools III: Bully Prevention go to http://www.pbs.org/teacherline/catalog/courses/LEAD1103
 - 2. Suicide Prevention. Beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, and every other year thereafter, a minimum of one (1) hour of high quality suicide prevention training shall be required for all All high school and middle school principals, guidance counselors and teachers. The training shall be provided either in-person, by live streaming, or via a video recording. Annual training provided by district psychologists is the suggested format for delivery of this training. Another option is to follow this link http://sptsuniversity.org/ and then go to the "courses" heading and select "2016-17 National Version-making Educators Partners in Youth Suicide Prevention: Act on facts". Compliance with KRS 156.095.
 - _3. Confidentiality Training. I have received training in confidentiality procedures. Information relating to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), and the Individuals w/ Disabilities Education Act of 2004 (IDEA) has been presented to me. I understand that I am required to comply with these laws and can be subject disciplinary action for non-compliance. All school personnel.
 - _4. Blood Borne Pathogens. I have received training regarding blood borne pathogens and understand the safety precautions which must be taken when dealing with blood and bodily fluids. All school personnel Compliance with board policy 3.14 and OSHS 1910.1030.
 - 5. Mandatory reporting of child abuse. KRS 620.030 states that <u>everyone</u> who has reasonable cause to believe that a child is dependent, abused or neglected should report this information to the proper authorities; however, teachers are <u>required</u> to submit a more detailed report as part of their professional duties. SB 119 amended KRS 156.095 requiring all current school administrators, certified personnel, office staff, instructional assistants, and coaches and extracurricular sponsors who are employed by the school district to complete a KDE approved comprehensive evidence-informed training on child abuse and neglect prevention, recognition, and reporting. Please review the KDE approved training titled "*SB119 Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect*" <u>thoroughly with all above mentioned staff and collectively complete the attached PDF titled "*Child Abuse, Neglect, and Dependency Training Post-Training Assessment*" https://education.ky.gov/teachers/Documents/SB119 PDF CHFS Posting 8 26 2016.pdf
